Scenic Overlooks

A great way to start your explorations of the Kamiah Valley is to drive up for a birds eye view at one of the scenic overlooks.



Hwy 64 Overlook, located a short drive up HWY 64, the Nezperce grade is a good spot to take in the valley. Paved to this point on HWY 64. For the adventurous souls you can continue on up HWY 64 to Nezperce and the Camas Prairie.



Woodland Road, "The Hogs Back" Overlook. Located at the top of the Woodland Road grade on the North side of the Kamiah Valley, offers a birds eye view of Kamiah and Southward into the Gospel Hump Wilderness and Nezperce National Forest.



Riverfront Park and Nature Trail

Historical Sites



Heart of the Monster

Nezperce National Historic Park Site. Located on the banks of the Clearwater River across from Kamiah, the Heart of the Monster is the legendary birthplace of the Nezperce tribe. Walking paths, interpretive signs and picnic tables await your visit.



Kamiah Valley Museum, located on Main Street has many interesting exhibits including Lewis and Clark information, local farming implements, early medical equipment, crafts made by the Nezperce Tribe, Mammoth bones and other items from the diverse history of the Kamiah area. The museum is open Memorial Day through Labor Day on Wed-Fri 10 AM to 4 PM, admission is free, donations accepted.
